

What value will it bring to your organization? How is it furthering the appreciation for arts and humanities in your community? Scheer Genius, with Doug Scheer, will present its Diversity Circus program twice at the Alcona Schools Auditorium for students in grades K through 5, dividing the audience by age range, so that about 150 students will attend each show. Mr. Scheer's show is designed to show the value of individuals and their differences from others, as well as the commonalities that all people share. This message is particularly appropriate for children in Alcona, where the general population is more than 97 percent white. Central to the show are Mr. Scheer's four named themes, as listed on his website:

"FAIR - Learning not to judge others or make guesses about them.

"AWARE - Understanding what's inside is what matters most.

"INCLUDE - Thinking of others first is the secret to getting along.

"RESPECT - Aesop's fable of the Lion and the Mouse magically brought to life."

The first of these is especially important because Alcona students have so few opportunities to interact with people of other races or cultures. This exposure will serve them well as a basis for their future interactions with the larger world outside Alcona County. Teachers will also be able to use these themes in teaching other interactions that rely on person-to-person understanding, such as welcoming new students and working to decrease bullying.

| INSTRUCTIONS FOR CERTIFICATIONS |

- 1. The Michigan Humanities Council is required to seek from all applicants a certification regarding compliance with nondiscrimination statutes and certification regarding debarment and suspension.
- 2. By signing and submitting the form, which follows these instructions, the authorizing official of the applicant organization/institution provides the applicable certifications. When a prospective applicant is unable to provide the Council with certification regarding the nondiscrimination statutes, the prospective applicant is not eligible to apply for funding from the Council. When the applicant is unable to provide certification on debarment and suspension, the applicant shall attach an explanation to the proposal. The explanation of why the certification on debarment and suspension cannot be submitted will be considered in

this proposal.

- 4. The certifications are material representation of the facts on which reliance will be placed when the Council determined to fund the application. If it is later determined that the applicant knowingly provided erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the federal government, the National Endowment for the Humanities may pursue available remedies including suspension and/or debarment.
- 5. The applicant shall provide immediate written notice to the Michigan Humanities Council if at any time the applicant learns that its certifications were erroneous when submitted or have become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
- 6. The applicant agrees by submitting this proposal that, should the proposal be funded by the Council, it shall not knowingly enter into any project-related transaction (as defined under "lower tier covered transactions") with a person who is debarred, suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this covered transaction, unless authorized by the National Endowment for the Humanities.
- 7. The applicant further agrees by submitting this proposal to include without modification the following clause in all lower tier covered transactions and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions:
- (1) The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal department or agency.
- (2) Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.
- 8. A participant in a covered transaction may rely on the certification of a prospective participant in a lower tier covered transaction that is not debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from the transaction, unless it knows that its certification is erroneous. A participant may decide the method and frequency by which it determined the eligibility of its principals. Each participant may, but is not required to, check the list of "Parties Excluded from Nonprocurement Programs."
- 9. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course for business dealings.
- 10. Except when specifically authorized by the National Endowment for the Humanities, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to the other remedies available to the federal government, the National Endowment for the Humanities may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment.

- (a) Any transaction between a participant and a person other than a procurement contract for goods or services, regardless of type, under a primary covered transaction.
- (b) Any procurement contract for goods or services between a participant and a person, regardless of type, expected to equal or exceed the federal procurement small purchase threshold fixed at 10 U.S.C. 2304(g) and 41 U.S.C. 235(g) (currently \$25,000) under a primary covered transaction.
- (c) Any procurement contract for goods or services between a participant and a person under a covered transaction, regardless of amount, under which that person will have a critical influence on or substantive control over that covered transaction. Such persons are project directors, principal investigators, and providers of federally required audit services.

Participant: any person who submits a proposal for, enters into, or reasonably may be expected to enter into a covered transaction. This term also includes any person who acts on behalf of or is authorized to commit a participant in a covered transaction as an agent or representative of another participant.

Person: any individual, corporation, partnership, association, unit of government, or legal entity, however organized, except foreign governments of foreign governmental entities, public international organizations, or foreign government owned or controlled entities.

Primary Covered Transactions: this is normally any nonprocurement transaction between an agency and a person, regardless of type, including grants, cooperative agreements, scholarships, fellowships, contracts of assistance, loans, loan guarantees, subsidies, insurance, payments for specified use, donation agreements and any other nonprocurement transaction between a federal agency and a person.

Principal: officer, director, owner, partner, key employee, or other person within a participant with primary management or supervisory responsibilities; or a person who has critical influence on or substantive control over a covered transaction, whether or not employed by the participant.

Proposal: a solicited or unsolicited bid, application, request, invitation to consider, or similar communication by or on behalf of a person seeking to participate or receive benefit, directly or indirectly, in or under a covered transaction.

Suspension: an action taken by a suspending official in accordance with these regulations that immediately excludes a person from participating in covered transactions for a temporary period, pending completion of an investigation and such legal, debarment of Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act proceedings as may

ensue.

Voluntarily excluded: the status of nonparticipation or limited participation in covered transactions assumed by the person pursuant to the terms of a settlement.

1. **Certification Regarding the Nondiscrimination Statutes** The applicant (other than an individual who submits an application to the Michigan Humanities Council) certifies that it will comply with the following nondiscrimination statutes and their implementing regulations:

- (b) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), which provides that no otherwise qualified individual with a disability in the United States, shall, solely by reason of his/her disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance;
- (c) Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681 et seq.), which provides that no person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance;
- (d) the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.), which provides that no person in the United States shall, on the basis of age, be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.
- (e) The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA") prohibits discrimination *on the basis of disability* in employment (Title 1), state and local government services (Title II), places of public accommodation and commercial facilities (Title III). (42 U.S.C. 12101-12213)

2. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion—Lower Tier Covered Transactions (45 CFR 1169)

- (a) The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal department or agency.
- (b) Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify any of the statements in certification, such prospective shall attach an explanation to this proposal.
